



GILL GATFIELD

Biography

Aotearoa New Zealand artist Gill Gatfield works across sculpture, lens-based media, extended reality (XR), AI, and public art. Through conceptual abstraction, her practice braids ancient intelligence with posthuman futures at fault lines of justice, gender, science, and technology. She carves and weaves matter, code, space, and text, combining minimalism and machine learning with primordial systems to probe tangible and ephemeral states of being. Origin-coded stone, Ice-Age wood, crystal glass, gold, fibre, and grass are translated into monochromatic fields and first-forms where material and digital registers interlock, and classical codes meet futurist conditions. The works activate deep time through layered protocols (mythological, material, machinic, embodied), exploring memory and instinct as sites of becoming.

Current research in *Ephemeral Monuments* and *Habeas Corpus* explores embodiment within operating systems that shape presence, testing participation as a perceptual and sensory bridge.

Gill Gatfield holds a Master of Fine Arts (Hons) and a Bachelor of Laws from the University of Auckland. Following a decade in human rights law, public policy, and systems design, she founded Gatfield Studio as a laboratory for experimentation and interdisciplinary collaboration. She has held artist residencies and research scholarships at NARS Foundation New York (2025), Foreign Objekt Computation & Intelligence Lab (2024–25), Saas-Fee Summer Art Institute New York (2024), Poison Creek Sculpture Project New Zealand (2023–24), Ionion Center for Arts & Culture Greece (2023), Vermont Studio Center USA (2019), and KØN Museum Denmark (2015).

Working site-responsively across museums, galleries, public space, sculpture parks, digital platforms, and hybrid contexts, her work has been presented at NARS Foundation NYC (2025), Brooklyn Bridge Park NYC (2024–25), Waitangi Treaty Grounds NZ (2024), Aotearoa NZ Festival of the Arts (2024), Wellington Sculpture Trust / Museum of New Zealand Te Papa Tongarewa (2023–24), UNESCO Global Geopark Kefalonia & Ithaca Greece (2023), European Cultural Centre at Venice Art Biennale (2022), Kunstverein am Rosa Luxemburg Platz Berlin (2021–22), Dominik Mersch Gallery Sydney (2021), MetroArts Brisbane (2022), Sculpture by Sea Perth (2021), Venice Architecture Biennale (2018), A'18 American Institute of Architecture NYC (2018), SCAPE Public Art (2016), KØN Museum Denmark (2015), Sculpture by Sea Aarhus (2015), Sculpture by Sea Sydney (2014), and Chicago Sculpture International (2014).

A monograph *Abstract Figure: Gill Gatfield* was launched at the International Sculpture Centre Symposium 2013.

Before establishing Gatfield Studio (1998), she held roles as solicitor / attorney in commercial and tax law, legal policy analyst at NZ Government Ministry for Women, and founder and director of Equity Works Ltd. (1993-98), a consulting business specialising in human rights law and practices, advising government, NGOs, institutions, and corporates. In that role, she led industry-wide gender equity investigations, and designed systems-solutions. Twice awarded NZ Law Foundation research grants, Gill Gatfield wrote the landmark text *Without Prejudice: Women in the Law* (Brooker's 1996) addressing gender bias in the legal and judicial systems. The book was reissued under a new title: *Without Prejudice: Same Issue - New Cover* (Thomson Reuters Ebook 2018) and in hardback (Gatfield Studio 2016) during the #metoo movement.

Gill Gatfield contributes to national and international forums on creative technologies, public art, and conceptual-AI, and is convener of the Global Women AI Equity Revolution, a collaboration of thought leaders promoting social and economic justice through generative and agentic technologies.
