

SCULPTURE BY THE SEA-ARTIST OCCUPIES WOMEN'S MUSEUM

Gill Gatfield Glasloft // Glass Ceiling



Reception saturday the 4th of july at 3p.m. at Women's Museum, Domkirkepladsen 5

Women's Museum is currently working hard at getting more tons of crushed glass into an art installation by the New Zealand artist Gill Gatfield.

Gill Gatfield is participating in the exhibition Sculpture by the Sea with her work *The Kiss*, and she is artist in residence at Women's Museum in her time being in Aarhus.

At the museum she is a regular part of daily life and she is currently installing the art work called *GLASS CEILING // GLASLOFTET* made especially for Women's Museum. The concept is intended for the building and for a smaller room, adjacent to the old council hall (the Women's museum building is former city hall of Aarhus, ed.) Curator at The Women's Museum, Julie Rokkjær Birch says:

"It's a great pleasure to have Gill at the museum. Her work is about the metaphor 'glass ceiling', which is a political term used to describe the invisible yet unbreakable barrier that prevents women and minorities from reaching the top of the career ladder and political life regardless of their qualifications. This installation could not be more appropriate than now in the centenary for women's suffrage in Denmark. That Gill is from New Zealand, the country where women first got the vote, certainly dots the i."

Gill Gatfield describes her work as follows:

"At the Women's Museum Denmark, the notion of the glass ceiling is exposed to view. Glass ceiling // Glass Ceiling can be experienced as a thing of beauty and as a sculptural metaphor. Through an interplay of context, site, material, form, scale and title, the work conveys ideas and questions about perspective, desire, access, and ascent. It offers a liminal space for us to consider what is at our feet."
